



SATURDAY ART CLUB AT HOME

Hi everyone!

On Sunday 14th March, Mother's Day is celebrated in the UK - why not use it as an opportunity to celebrate someone special in your life whether they are your mum or not!

Here's how to make a floral bouquet out of paper, scissors and tape (If you are very young please make sure that an adult does the cutting out for you):



1. Start by creating your flower stems. All you need to do is roll up your chosen paper into tubes and secure in place with tape. Make sure they are rolled fairly tight.
2. Next, add your leaves by cutting leaf shapes out of the same colour paper and taping them on to the tubes.



3. Now, create your flower heads- make a smaller tube out of paper that is a different colour to your stem- small enough to fit inside your stem tube. Next, cut strips all around one end of your tube, so that they go about half the way down and fan the strips out to make your petals. You can repeat this with another colour of paper to fit inside your flower head so that it has a centre.

4. Add leaves and flower heads to all your stems and arrange in a suitable jar or small vase. Then give it to someone special!!

SOME MORE IDEAS

- If you only have one colour of paper you could paint it different colours or add different patterns
- If you don't have a vase or jar you could create your own vase using a toilet roll tube or piece of card
- or you could wrap the flowers up with paper, just like a florist!
