



SATURDAY ART CLUB AT HOME

Happy Saturday everyone :)

This week we'll be starting stage 2 of our mini gallery project- creating the '*gallery space*'. Last week, inspired the idea of creating an exhibition at home, we created miniature/small scale artworks to put in our gallery. This week we'll look at how to make a mini gallery from a cardboard box.

1. Find a cardboard box. This could be a delivery box, a shoebox or cereal/food packaging box, just something big enough for your mini artworks. Start by removing the top and one of the sides (if your box is a rectangle, remove one of the longest sides). This will give you three walls and a floor to work with.



2. Line the inside of your box with a paper colour of your choice (you can use glue and/or sellotape). I chose plain white paper as I wanted to paint on top of it.

3. Place/attach your mini artworks inside the gallery space. How does it look? do you need to take away or add artworks? If you want to be inspired, you can see a selection of gallery tours online [here](#)



4. Decorate your gallery! I decided that I didn't want my gallery to just have plain white walls...I wanted my mini artworks to interact with their surroundings so I made my gallery space into a sort of '3D' painting and imagined myself walking around in there. Experiment and have fun!
