We are going to start with a simple but effective activity - ***duplicate collage***. We hope this will brighten up your Saturday morning and be a nice calming and relaxing process to take part in.


MATERIALS:

Colour paper, glue stick, cardboard (e.g cereal packet or similar), scissors (to be used by an adult if you are very young), a pen/pencil, a large piece of paper to collage on to.





HOW TO:

1. Start by drawing a variety of shapes on to your cardboard. You could do this freehand or draw around things in your house. Some ideas are: circle, squares, ovals, stars. Moons, hearts. Simple is good!
2. Cut the shapes out of the cardboard.



3. Put 2+ pieces of colour paper together and draw around one of your shapes. Hold the colour paper together so that you can cut the shape out and it will be cut out of each piece of paper.
4. Now you should have your 'duplicate' shapes. Repeat this process as many times as you like, so that you have a good selection of repeated shapes in a variety of colours.



5. Get pasting! Use a large piece of paper to stick your shapes down in overlapping and interesting ways. Fill the sheet!
